Oak House, our purpose-built student accommodation opened in September 2017. The house offers you a more independent living experience in preparation for university life and beyond. Oak House is just a few minutes walk to the College campus, allowing for easy access into college life, both academically and socially. It's also only a 10-15 minute walk to town and there is a pedestrian and cycle path which links the College directly to Vivary Park and the town centre.

Oak House offers a fantastic communal area and living space downstairs and has 53 study bedrooms including a range of single, twin, accessible and premium bedrooms, with dedicated floors for male and female students. Breakfast and an evening meal is provided each day and served at Oak House.

On the ground floor you will have access to the large and modern open-plan kitchen, dining area and lounge complete with TV, games consoles and piano. The house is equipped with free WiFi access throughout. You will have free access to a laundry room equipped with washing machines, tumble dryers and detergent. Outside includes a private garden with seating and bicycle storage.

All bedrooms are en-suite, meaning you have your own bathroom (toilet, sink and shower) and we are able to offer some larger premium rooms detailed in the Accommodation Options section. In your room you will have a single duvet, pillow, mattress protector, fitted sheet, desk and chair, bookcase and notice board included.

You will need to bring with you a duvet cover and pillowcase and your own towels. Our Housekeeper will clean your bedroom and bathroom on a weekly basis. Oak House is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Your pastoral care is very important to us and we have two live-in House Parents and several part-time House Parents who will help you settle into life in Taunton, and with your studies at Huish. They are supported by a team of support staff, housekeepers and groundsmen who are always on hand to help. The house has an electronic card entry system allowing staff to know which students are in or out of the house and you are expected to follow the house rules as outlined in the Boarding Handbook, which is distributed to you following a successful application.

Note: Students must be a minimum of 16 years old to board in Oak House.





ACCOMMODATION OPTIONS

At Oak House, we have a variety of students who choose to either board full-time or on a flexi-board basis. If your journey to college is long or you are used to boarding at your current school, Oak House could be just what you need.

FULL-TIME BOARDING IS SUITABLE FOR:

- Students with sporting commitments, such as evening matches or training
- Students who have after-college enrichment
- Students who have a long commute
- Students who are returning to the UK for education after living abroad e.g. armed forces, work
- Students who are used to boarding at their current school.

THE 2024/25 PROVISIONAL FULL-TIME FEE FOR A STANDARD ROOM IS:

- £14,500.00 per annum, plus
- £1,500.00 refundable deposit

Full-time boarding fees will be invoiced yearly in advance. A payment schedule will be sent to you outlining the fees payable and requesting confirmation of payment in one, two, or three instalments. Your invoice will be generated on receipt of this.

Once your yearly invoice has been issued, your first payment will be required within 30 days of the invoice (usually raised in June/July), or by the first day of term, whichever comes first. If payment is not received on time, we reserve the right to withdraw you from boarding. Refunds will not be given for nights missed.

FLEXI-BOARDING AND OCCASIONAL BOARDING

Flexi-boarding means you stay at Oak House for 3 or more nights per week. Students who apply for 1 or 2 nights per week will be considered as occasional boarders.

IT IS SUITABLE FOR:

- Students with sporting commitments, such as evening matches or training
- Students who have after-college enrichment
- Students who have a long commute.

THE 2024/25 NIGHTLY FEE IS:

- £60.00 per night, plus
- £1,500.00 refundable deposit









Fees include bedroom with en-suite facilities, dinner and breakfast. Flexi-boarding fees will be invoiced yearly in advance, and any additional days incurred will be invoiced at the end of each month. You will be sent a booking form in June/July in order to pre-book your nights, and the invoice will be generated on receipt of this.

Once your invoice has been issued, the first payment will be required within 30 days of the invoice, or by the first day of each term, whichever comes first. If payment is not received on time, we reserve the right to withdraw you from boarding.

Monthly invoices will be issued thereafter for any additional nights incurred. These must be agreed with the House Manager beforehand to check room availability. Refunds will not be given for nights missed.

PAYMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

REFUNDABLE DEPOSIT

Regardless of boarding type, a refundable deposit will be returned to you at the end of your stay providing all fees are paid to date and no damage has been caused to your accommodation. This is currently £1,500.00.

BOOKING DEPOSIT

When applying for boarding we will require a booking deposit to secure a room. This is non-refundable but will be deducted from your boarding fees invoice. This is currently £1,000.00 for full-time boarders, and £500.00 for flexi-boarders.

PAYMENT

Whether you are a full-time or flexi-boarder, your booking once confirmed will be for the full college year. For flexi-boarders this is particularly important as we will be allocating the days of the week you wish to board for thewhole year (excluding Christmas, half terms and Easter holidays only) and will therefore not be able to allocate those term days to anyone else.

LATE PAYMENT FEE

If you fail to pay your fees within the given deadline (as stated on your invoice), you will incur a late payment fee of £100.00 per overdue payment to cover administration costs, this may also jeopardise your boarding place.

NOTICE FOR WITHDRAWAL/CANCELLATION, OR CHANGES TO BOARDING TYPE

For boarding students of all categories joining us, the required notice to leave Oak House or change boarding type is 3 months from the date that notice is given. We will make best endeavours to secure a substitute of the same category to minimise the financial impact of the notice period. Should we be unsuccessful in securing a substitute, the full boarding fee for the 3-month notice period will be charged.

ALLOCATION OF ROOMS

Priority is given, in the first instance, to students wishing to board on a full-time basis. Once we have allocated bedrooms to full-time students, any remaining beds will be allocated to 'flexi-boarders' on a 'first come first served' basis. Premium rooms are allocated on a 'first come first served' basis.

BOARDING FEES

Boarding fees are revised yearly. We appreciate that you will want to know any increases in fees as soon as possible, in the current economic climate we are anticipating fees to increase between 5% and 20%. We will endeavour to update families as soon as fees are confirmed.

REFUNDS

In order for Richard Huish College to consider any claim for a refund/reimbursement of fees, the claim must be submitted in writing no more than 30 days after your course end date/last day of lessons if you have left the course early.

Rooms are booked in advance, so please note that no refunds will be given to boarders for nights missed, nor we will carry forward or bank, any bookings to alternative nights.




HOW TO APPLY

Applications to study at Huish can be made through our website, using the QR Code below. On the application form, you will need to register your interest in boarding and this will be discussed at your Advice and Guidance meeting with our Admissions team.

The number of places available to study at Huish is not limited and you can apply at any point of the year, however boarding places are limited, so we would recommend you apply early (November – March) to register your place at Oak House. Your room will be secured once you have paid your booking deposit.

For an A Level /Level 3 Vocational Study Programme you need to achieve five GCSEs at Grade 4 or above including Mathematics and English (Language or Literature). For some courses there may be additional requirements (please refer to the individual course pages on our website for details). The entry requirements for a Level 2 Pathway is a GCSE profile of Grade 3s.









SAFEGUARDING AND EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES


