Oak House is just a few minutes walk to the College campus, allowing for easy access into college life, both academically and socially. It's also only a 10–15 minute walk to town and there is a pedestrian and cycle path which links the College directly to Vivary Park and the town centre.

Oak House offers a fantastic communal area where you have access to a large and modern open-plan kitchen, dining area and lounge, complete with TV, games consoles and piano. The house is equipped with free WiFi access throughout. You will have free access to a laundry room equipped with washing machines, tumble dryers and detergent. Outside includes a private garden with seating and bicycle storage.

All 53 bedrooms are en-suite, meaning you have your own bathroom (toilet, sink and shower). In your room you will have a single duvet, pillow, mattress protector, fitted sheet, desk, chair, bookcase and notice board included.

Oak House is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and your pastoral care is very important to us. We have a team of residential and non-residential staff that will help you settle into life in Taunton and assist you with your studies at Huish. They are supported by a team of support staff, housekeepers and estates who are always on hand to help.

Note: Students must be a minimum of 16 years old to board in Oak House.

ACCOMMODATION OPTIONS AND FEES

We offer full-time, weekly or flexi-boarding. Priority placements are given to full-time boarders. A nightly fee is applicable to weekly or flexi-boarding.

FULL-TIME BOARDING

Oak House is open all year round, apart from the Christmas and Summer holidays. Full-time fees include half terms and Easter holidays.

WEEKLY AND FLEXI-BOARDING OPTIONS

Weekly boarders stay Sunday night to Thursday night (term-time).

Flexi-boarding means you stay at Oak House for 4 nights or less per week (term-time).

Any additional nights must be agreed with the House Manager in advance. These will be dependent on the availability of rooms and are invoiced at the end of each month.

Refunds will not be given for nights missed, nor can we bank or carry them forward.

FEES 2027/28

The provisional full-time fee for a standard room is £18,000.00 per annum, plus a £1,500.00 refundable deposit.

The provisional nightly fee is £70.00 per night, plus a £1,500.00 refundable deposit. Fees include a bedroom with en-suite, evening meal and breakfast.

Payments:

- All boarding contracts are yearly regardless of boarding type
- All invoices are issued annually with a breakdown of payment dates
- A payment schedule will be sent to you outlining the fees payable and requesting confirmation of payment in one, two or three instalments. Your invoice will be generated on receipt of this.

HERE IS JUST A SELECTION OF WAYS YOU CAN GET INVOLVED:

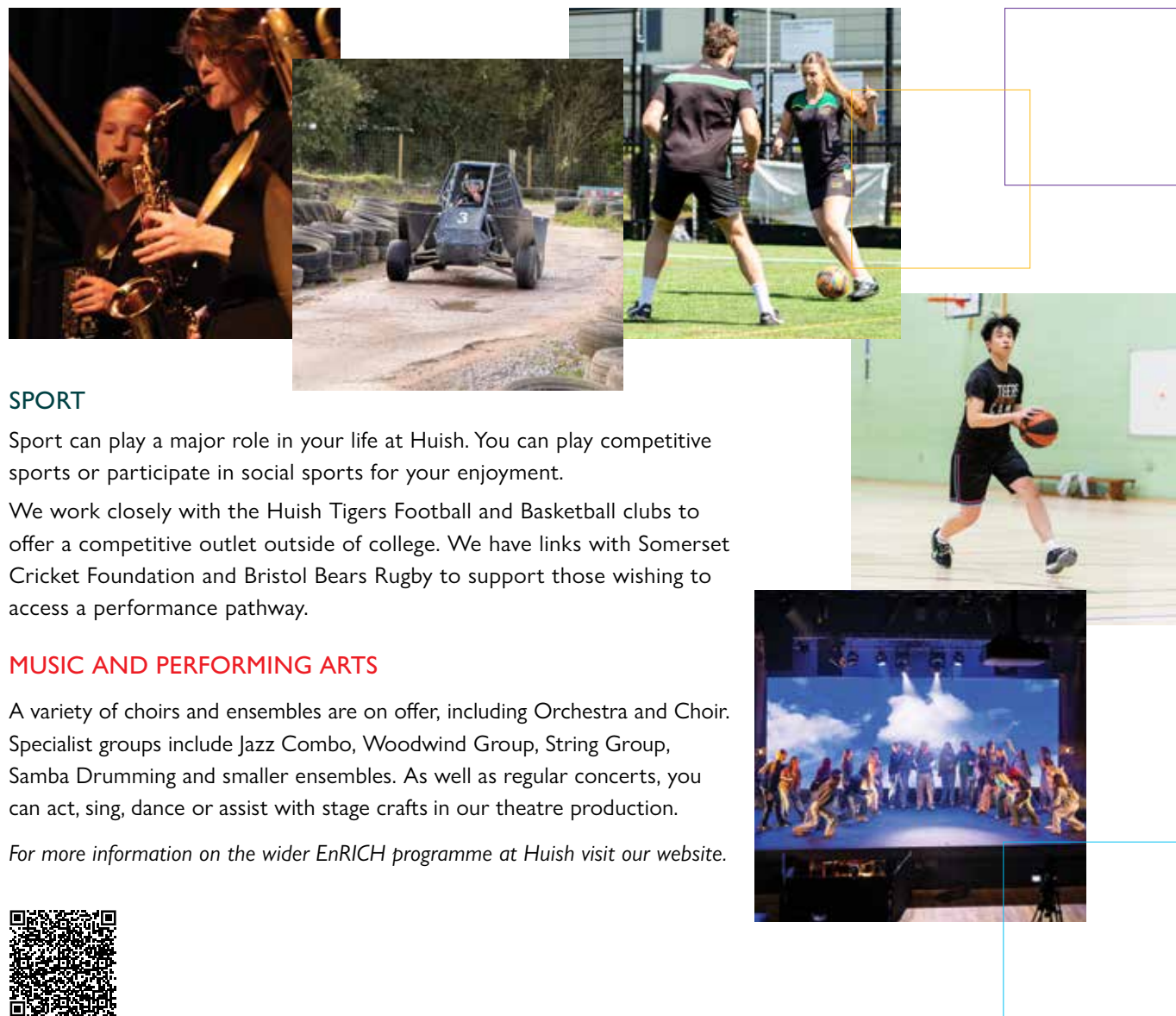
OAK HOUSE

Oak House offers enrichment activities to boarders every weekday, evening and weekend during term-time.

The activities range from crafts and baking to sporting activities on our 3G pitch. You will also have exclusive access to the Huish gym one evening a week.

There are several trips available throughout the year, with past favourites including ice-skating, visits to a local beach, go-karting, and shopping trips to nearby cities.

We are always open to suggestions of activities and trips that you would like to take part in.



SPORT

Sport can play a major role in your life at Huish. You can play competitive sports or participate in social sports for your enjoyment.

We work closely with the Huish Tigers Football and Basketball clubs to offer a competitive outlet outside of college. We have links with Somerset Cricket Foundation and Bristol Bears Rugby to support those wishing to access a performance pathway.

MUSIC AND PERFORMING ARTS

A variety of choirs and ensembles are on offer, including Orchestra and Choir. Specialist groups include Jazz Combo, Woodwind Group, String Group, Samba Drumming and smaller ensembles. As well as regular concerts, you can act, sing, dance or assist with stage crafts in our theatre production.

SAFEGUARDING AND PASTORAL SUPPORT

The safety, wellbeing, and happiness of every student are at the heart of everything we do at Huish.

Our experienced pastoral and safeguarding teams work closely with boarding students to ensure you feel safe, supported, and able to thrive both personally and academically. We recognise that living away from home can be an exciting but sometimes challenging experience, and we are committed to helping you develop confidence, independence, resilience, and a strong sense of belonging within our boarding community.

You will have access to a dedicated team of pastoral professionals who monitor and support your physical, emotional, and mental wellbeing. They will regularly check on your welfare and are available to provide guidance whenever needed. Where concerns arise, we work quickly and sensitively to provide appropriate support, involving parents and carers where appropriate, and ensuring you receive the help you need at the earliest opportunity.

Our pastoral staff work closely with teaching staff, tutors, residential staff, and external agencies to ensure that each student receives coordinated support. Through regular communication and information sharing, we can identify emerging needs, remove barriers to learning, and ensure you are supported both inside and outside the classroom.

Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility at Huish. We maintain robust safeguarding procedures and a strong culture of vigilance to protect all students from harm. All staff receive regular safeguarding training and are committed to recognising concerns, responding appropriately, and promoting the welfare of young people. Our designated safeguarding team provides expert oversight and works in partnership with students, families, local authorities, health services, and other agencies to ensure that every student is safeguarded effectively.

We are proud to provide a caring and inclusive environment where every student is known, valued, and supported. Our aim is to give parents confidence that, while students are developing their independence, they are doing so within a safe, nurturing community where their wellbeing remains our highest priority.

HOW TO APPLY



When you apply online to Huish you will need to register your interest in boarding and this will be discussed at your Advice and Guidance meeting with our Admissions team.

Applications open in the Autumn Term for the following academic year. Boarding places are limited so we recommend applying early (November – March). Your room will be secured once you have paid your booking deposit.

For a Level 3 A Level/Vocational Study Programme you need to achieve five GCSEs or equivalent at Grade 9-4 including Mathematics and English Language. For a Triple Vocational qualification, a Level 2 Vocational qualification can be accepted in place of a GCSE. For some courses there may be additional requirements (please refer to the individual course pages on our website for details).

The entry requirements for a Level 2 Pathway is a GCSE profile of mainly Grade 3s including Maths and English Language.

If you don't have GCSE's or an equivalent Level 2 qualification, we will invite you to complete an assessment with us in Maths and English.



PAYMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

REFUNDABLE DEPOSIT

A refundable deposit will be returned to you at the end of your stay providing all fees are paid to date and no damage has been caused. This is currently £1,500.00.

BOOKING DEPOSIT

We require a booking deposit to secure a room. This is non-refundable but is deducted from your boarding fees invoice. This is currently £2,000.00 for all types of boarders.

PAYMENT

Once confirmed, your booking will be for the full college year. For weekly and flexi-boarders, we allocate the days of the week you wish to board for the whole year (excluding Christmas, half terms and Easter holidays) and are therefore not able to allocate those days to anyone else.

LATE PAYMENT FEE

If you fail to pay your fees within the deadline stated on your invoice you will incur a late payment fee of £100.00 per overdue payment to cover administration costs. This may also jeopardise your boarding place.

NOTICE FOR WITHDRAWAL/CANCELLATION OR CHANGES TO BOARDING TYPE

The required notice to leave Oak House or change boarding type is 1 term from the date the notice is given. We will endeavour to secure a substitute of the same category to minimise the financial impact of the notice period. Should we be unsuccessful in securing a substitute, the full boarding fee for the 1 term notice period will be charged.

ALLOCATION OF ROOMS

Priority is given to full-time boarders. Once we have allocated bedrooms to full-time boarders any remaining beds will be allocated to weekly and then flexi-boarders on a 'first come first served' basis. Premium rooms are allocated on a 'first come first served' basis.

BOARDING FEES

Boarding fees are revised annually. We appreciate that you will want to know any increases in fees as soon as possible; in the current economic climate, we anticipate fees increasing by no more than 10%.

Please note fees and Terms and Conditions are correct at the time of printing. Please check with Admissions for updates when applying.

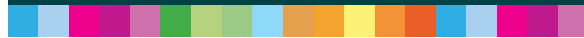
REFUNDS

For us to consider any claim for a refund/reimbursement of fees, the claim must be submitted in writing no more than 30 days after your course end date/last day of lessons if you have left the course early.

Rooms are booked in advance, so please note that no refunds will be given to boarders for nights missed, nor we will carry forward or bank any bookings for alternative nights.

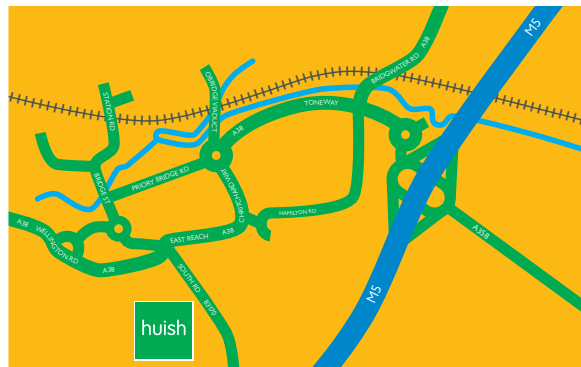
